Medical centre to hand out 30 baby car seats in child safety campaign

SIBU: Sibu Specialist Medical Centre (SSMC) is giving out 30 baby car seats for early birds who register for labour this month at the centre.

Its general manager Denis Saving Boniface said this is part of SSMC's 'Buckle Up, Baby' campaign which pre-launched yesterday.

He said the campaign aims to create awareness of baby safety in order to minimise child fatalities in road accidents.

"This will also be an opportunity for SSMC to give back to the community," he said during the pre-launching at the centre.

Explaining on the criteria of those eligible for the car seats, Denis said they must deliver at SSMC under resident consultants Dr Toh Siu Gap and Dr Li Hie Ing.
